

October Kicked Off New 4-H Year

4-H is open to any youth ages 7-18 in Kansas. Also, Cloverbuds are available for 5 & 6 year olds. 4-H Online is the program that manages project enrollment, family contact information, and volunteers. It is important that you check this information each year when members enroll. The office downloads addresses and email addresses multiple times throughout the year to stay current.

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Read 4-H

Read 4-H is a program for 4-H members to read books and earn rewards! The Extension Office will select one required book to read that has a movie adaptation. Once they have read a book, they will complete a Book Review form provided by the Office. After completing the form it can then be submitted to the Extension Office. They can compile reviews to create a reading project book that will be eligible for judging later on! Participants can read however many books they choose **BUT** 4-Her's must read books at their reading level. There will be a Junior and Senior level book available. Intermediates may choose which level to read at but they must watch the film associated with that book.

Once the 4-Her has read the Extension selected book they must complete a Book Review form, and submit it to the Office. This earns their ticket to the bi-monthly reward night to enjoy snacks and the movie adaptation of the Extension selected book. The participant who reads and submits the most Book Reviews will receive an additional prize!
