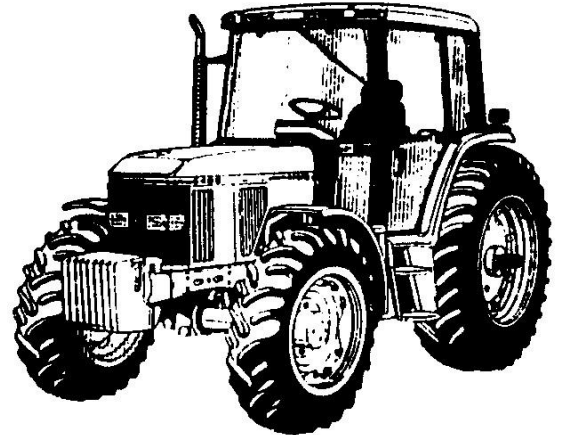


Tractor Safety

Who should take the course:

14 and 15 year olds planning to do farm work for someone other than a parent or guardian, must take a tractor safety course following the U.S. Department of Labor requirements before being employed for certain hazardous farm tasks. This includes operating a tractor over 20 horsepower.



Due to the Covid-19 precautions and restrictions Tractor Safety Training will be taken with a home online course for 2020. This course will consist of online modules, videos and test. Once this is complete the student will need to perform a Driving Skills Test to be administered by the student's family, employer or other approved adult.
